



WHAT TO BRING UPDATED 6-8-17

PLEASE TRY TO PACK IN ONE LARGE SUITCASE, ONE SMALL PERSONAL BAG AND ONE EQUIPMENT BAG. SPACE IS LIMITED IN VANS. YOU MAY HAVE TO CARRY SMALLER BAGS IN YOUR LAP TO AND FROM AIRPORT.

- ✓ Camera Gear that can be carried in a backpack or shoulder bag. **No rolling cases are allowed. No dedicated video recording equipment is allowed per our permit with the National Park Service**
 - ✓ Camera body, Back-up Camera,
 - ✓ Lenses- normal, wide, telephoto, macro- You will want to cover a 24mm-300mm range
 - ✓ Fresh batteries, battery chargers, car chargers - don't forget specialty batteries you may need
 - ✓ CF cards, card reader, USB drive
 - ✓ Tripod - Monopod
 - ✓ Flash (no studio lighting allowed)
 - ✓ Filters- ND, graduated ND, polarizer,
 - ✓ Cable release.
- ✓ Casual clothing. For travel and nightly fireside chats and seminars.
- ✓ Warm clothing. Jeans, sweatshirts, jackets, gloves, hoods, hats. Dress in layers. Temps will range from 30s to 70s while shooting. Hand warmers are great for your hands as well as keeping batteries fresh.
- ✓ Comfortable shoes. We will be hiking so boots are recommended. Water resistant and slip resistant shoes are ideal.
- ✓ Rain gear. Jackets, hoods, and plastic bags to protect yourself and your equipment.
- ✓ Flashlight with extra batteries- Head lamp
- ✓ Laptop computer. Computer power adapter
- ✓ Empty USB drive to share images
- ✓ Notebook/Pen - You will want to remember all you learned.
- ✓ Insect Repellant.
- ✓ Sun screen. Chapstick
- ✓ Binoculars.

✓ Spending money. You will be responsible for your own food, liquor, gate fees and/or gift items. Most park locations accept major credit cards. Limited ATM access

✓ Snack items for daily hikes

✓ Toiletries.

✓ GPS device if desired

✓ Prescription drugs.

✓ OTC Medication. These items are available in Gardiner

✓ First-Aid supplies - bandages, antibiotic cream, insect bite ointment

✓ Emergency contact information. Just in case

✓ A positive attitude.
